Mr. Edwards was born on January 26, 1925, was a graduate of Edwardsville High School, and graduated from Bloomsburg State College. He began his teaching career in Lower Moreland High School in suburban Philadelphia, and there he coached football, basketball and baseball. His love of teaching and sports continued and he later accepted a teaching position with the Lake-Lehman School District where he taught math and science for 29 years. He served the District as Athletic Director and coached football and other sports for many years.

The ultimate honor was bestowed upon him in 1982, when upon his retirement; the Lake-Lehman School Board honored him by naming the football stadium "The Edward H. Edwards Stadium."

Mr. Marchakitus who worked along side him for many years stated, in remembrance of Mr. Edwards on his passing on May 27, 1999, that "He was a legend in his own time. He was a people's person and a student's person. He was beloved enough to have a stadium named after him, while yet living. He served diligently and well, for a long period of time. He was very cooperative, understanding and had a great deal of respect for people." Mr. Marchakitus recalled that when the stadium was named after him, he was very humble. "He was a wonderful man."
