 - Jr. High Football
 - Baseball/Softball
- Upgrade and redo softball field (Grass)
- Upgrade and redo baseball field (Grass)

• School Athletics vs. Community

- Create to accommodate school district athletics first
- Community use utilizes non-scheduled school time

- Field house/Restrooms

Group 2A: Consolidation Options:

Objective: Brainstorm Pro's to Option 2A- Close Lake-Noxen & Ross Elementary; Demolish Lehman Jackson; Build a new K-6 Building consolidating to one campus.

Cost effective; Keeping elementary buildings- Status quo

- Operating cost of 1 building would be cheaper than 3 buildings
- Collaboration of staff would increase
- All special education programs in 1 building
- Curriculum/activities would be more consistent
- Special teachers/therapists/administration would not have to travel/reimbursement
- Improvement in air quality; Environmentally sensitive
- Easier for parents pick up/drop off
- Transportation costs would decrease
