Fred retired as Senior Associate Executive Director of Leadership Development and Outreach for the National Association of Elementary Principals in July of 2010. In this role Fred:

- Provided oversight for National Distinguished Principals recognition program, the annual National Leader's Conference and the annual convention hosting 3,500 attendees.
- Developed the Peer Assisted Leadership Services program (PALS principal mentoring program) and served as the programs lead trainer.
- Served as NAESP's professional representative at all levels of government and private business.
- Oversaw the writing of NAESP's landmark document, *Leading Learning Communities: Standards for What Principals Should Know And Be Able To Do* and edited the 2nd edition of the same document in 2008.
- Co-authored the texts, *School Leader Internship* and *A Guide for Principals: Implementing IDEA*.
- Served as an ad hoc member of the Board of Directors of the National Council of Professors of Educational Administration (NCPEA)
