

Athletics

Citizens Voice Athletes of the Week: Seth Berry & Lucy Honeywell



Student Teachers at LL




Q: Why did you choose to observe Mr. Kalinay, here at Lake-Lehman?


A: When you sign up to observe they ask all the schools in the area, so I didn't get to choose, but Mr. Kalinay has been a good teacher to observe.
