


# Lake-Lehman School District Lake-Noxen Elementary School Newsletter

## THINGS TO REMEMBER:

-Appointments to meet with Principal Klopp and teachers must always be scheduled in advance.

-Students are expected to be in attendance during the homeroom period beginning at 8:55.

-Educational Trip Request forms must be submitted a minimum of 1 week prior to a trip.

-If a student is ill, they must be fever free and symptom free for 24 hours without medication before they can return to school.

-Missed school work will be available for pick up after the 3rd consecutive day of absence. This pertains to both illness and trips.

-Unless the temperature is below 20 degrees, students will go out for recess. Please be sure your child is dressed appropriately to be outdoors for 30 minutes.
