Early Decision

Binding Agreement:

If you apply, you are saying you will attend if you are accepted.

You will have to withdraw your applications to other schools if accepted.

Can only apply Early Decision to 1 school.

E-Harmony Version: Arranged marriage; you have to get married to that college once they extend an offer.

Early Action

Non-Binding Agreement:

When you apply, you are NOT required to attend if accepted.

You can keep your applications to other schools if accepted.

Can apply Early Action to more than 1 school. Find out in December.

E-Harmony Version: You are in love and propose to that college in the hopes you can get married.

Rolling

Non-Binding Agreement:

You are not required to attend if accepted.

Colleges evaluate applications as they come in; typically hear back in 2-3 weeks of submitting application.

E-Harmony Version: Tinder dating – swiping left or right and hearing back fairly quickly about going out for a date.



Regular

Non-Binding Agreement:

You are not required to attend if accepted.

Colleges wait until deadline, read all applications, and send out all decisions at one time.

E-Harmony Version: Meet, go out on a date, decide you like the college, and choose to apply. It's a polygamous relationship.
